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1. THE FOUNDATION: YOUR ROLE & BASIC THEORY

Your Purpose as a Worship Guitarist

- Facilitator, not performer** - Your job is to support congregational singing
- Serve the song** - Make musical choices that enhance worship, not showcase skill
- Team player** - Your sound is one color in a larger tapestry

The Nashville Number System (Essential)

- I** = Root chord (home base) - Major
- IV** = The "other" major chord
- V** = Tense chord that wants resolution
- vi** = Emotional relative minor

•**ii, iii** = Additional color chords

Fretboard Fundamentals

- Notes:** E-A-D-G-B-E (standard tuning)
 - Half-steps:** 1 fret distance
 - Whole-steps:** 2 fret distance
 - Major scale pattern:** Root-2-3-4-5-6-7
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2. ESSENTIAL CHORDS & PROGRESSIONS

Core Chord Shapes

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OPEN CHORDS:

G: 3-2-0-0-3-3

C: x-3-2-0-1-0

D: x-x-0-2-3-2

Em: 0-2-2-0-0-0

Am: x-0-2-2-1-0

F: 1-3-3-2-1-1 (or x-x-3-2-1-1)

BARRE CHORDS:

E-shape: 0-2-2-1-0-0 (moveable)

A-shape: x-0-2-2-2-0 (moveable)

Universal Worship Progressions

- I - V - vi - IV** (Most common: "Hosanna," "Mighty to Save")
- vi - IV - I - V** ("How Great Is Our God")
- I - IV - I - V** (Classic hymn structure)
- I - V - vi - III - IV - I - IV - V** (Extended progression)

Capo Mastery

- Key of Ab:** Capo 1, play G shapes
 - Key of B:** Capo 2, play A shapes
 - Key of Eb:** Capo 3, play C shapes
 - Key of F#:** Capo 2, play E shapes
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3. MODERNIZING YOUR SOUND

Add 7th Chords

- Imaj7, IVmaj7:** Dreamy, beautiful (C → Cmaj7)
- V7:** Bluesy, tense (G → G7)
- vim7, iim7:** Smooth, emotional (Am → Am7)

Modern Voicings

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G: 3-2-0-0-0-3 or 10-10-12-12-12-10

C: x-3-5-5-5-3 or x-10-10-12-13-12

D: x-5-7-7-7-5 or x-x-0-7-10-10

Em: 0-7-5-0-0-0 or 12-12-12-12-12-12

Suspended Chords for Transitions

- Sus2:** Root-2-5 (sounds open, anticipatory)
 - Sus4:** Root-4-5 (sounds tense, needs resolution)
 - Use for:** Moving between sections smoothly
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4. ACOUSTIC GUITAR: THE RHYTHM ENGINE

Strumming Philosophy

- Verse:** Softer, simpler patterns
- Chorus:** Stronger, driving patterns
- Bridge:** Build intensity
- Outro:** Simplify, fade out

Essential Strumming Patterns

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Basic 4/4: D - D - U - U - D - U

Driving 8ths: D - U - D - U - D - U - D - U

Building: D - (mute) - U - D - U

Percussive Techniques

- Palm muting:** Create dynamics
 - "Chick" sound:** Muted upstrums for groove
 - Fingerpicking:** Intimate moments, verses
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5. ELECTRIC GUITAR: TEXTURE & ATMOSPHERE

Signal Chain Essentials

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Guitar → Tuner → Compression → Drive → Modulation → Delay → Reverb → Amp

Creating Atmosphere

- Pads:** Volume swells + long delay + reverb
- Arpeggios:** Simple, repeating patterns with modulation
- Drones:** Let single notes/sustained chords ring

Lead Guitar Philosophy

- Double melodies:** Play vocal lines
 - Counter melodies:** Simple complementary lines
 - Textural fills:** Space between vocal phrases
 - Less is more:** Serve the song, don't dominate
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6. ADVANCED APPLICATION

Ear Training Exercises

- 1.**Identify the I chord** - Find "home" in any song
- 2.**Hear the V-I resolution** - Recognize tension and release
- 3.**Predict the vi chord** - Feel the emotional shift

Transposition on the Fly

- With capo:** Use familiar shapes in new keys
- Without capo:** Use number system and moveable shapes
- Practice:** Play common progressions in all 12 keys

Reharmonization Techniques

- Relative minor swap:** I → vi (C → Am)
 - Major 7th addition:** Any major chord → maj7
 - Bass line movement:** Use inversions for smooth motion
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7. HEART & PHILOSOPHY OF WORSHIP

The Worship Musician's Heart

- **Preparation enables presence** - Know your parts to be spiritually engaged
- **Excellence reflects God's nature** - Offer your best
- **Flexibility serves the moment** - Be led by the Spirit, not the chart

Practical Team Dynamics

- **Listen first** - Your ears are your most important tool
 - **Eye contact** - Stay connected with leader and team
 - **Dynamic awareness** - Match the room's energy
 - **Know when to stop** - Silence can be powerful

Common Keys & Capo Positions

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Key of G: No capo (G-C-D-Em)

Key of A: Capo 2 (G-C-D-Em shapes)

Key of C: No capo (C-F-G-Am)

Key of D: Capo 2 (C-F-G-Am shapes)

Key of E: Capo 4 (C-F-G-Am shapes)

Chord Substitution Chart

Basic Chord	Modern Alternative	Effect
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C	Cmaj7	More beautiful
G	G/B or G/F#	Smoother bass

Basic Chord Modern Alternative Effect

F	Fmaj7	Dreamy
Am	Am7	Softer, jazzy
D	Dsus2 or Dsus4	Anticipatory

Effects Settings Guide

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DELAY: 400-600ms for rhythm, dotted 8th for leads

REVERB: Medium hall for rhythm, large plate for pads

DRIVE: Light OD for rhythm, medium for leads

COMPRESSION: 3:1 ratio for sustain
